Location

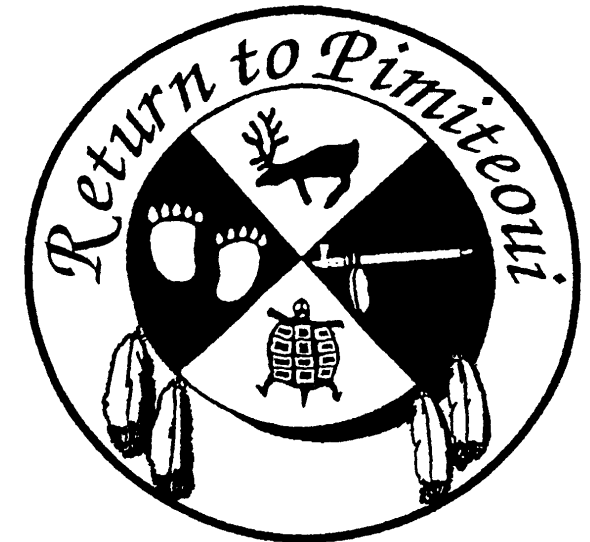

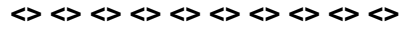

An Intertribal Pow Wow Peoria, Illinois

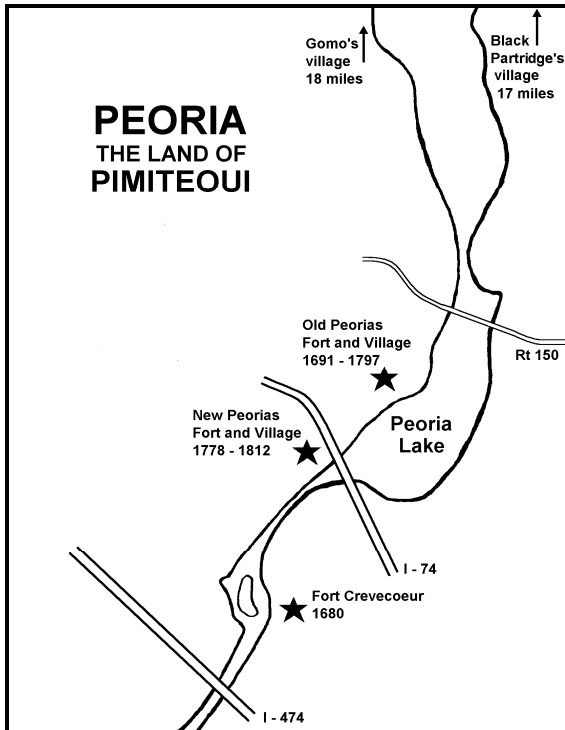
